Georgia Sheriffs' Association Chaplains Basic Certification Course New Curriculum January 1, 2020

The revision of the Chaplains Basic Certification Course curriculum in 2012 greatly improved the quality of training during the past seven years. The presence of chaplains, combined with their knowledge and honed skills acquired through chaplain's training and applied in the field, provided a vital service to our sheriffs and other law enforcement agencies.

To continue offering present-day educational information to maintain the integrity and caliber of this program, the Chaplains Basic Certification Course curriculum has undergone revision once again. The training requirements to achieve the basic certification is outlined below.

Part 1: Complete the online pre-requisite classes prior to attending the *20-Hour-Basic Certification Classroom Instruction* Five one-hour classes must be successfully completed. - Intro to Criminal Justice (1 hour)
- Office of Sheriff (1 hour)
- Introduction to Law Enforcement Chaplaincy (Role of Chaplain) (1 hour)
- Law Enforcement Ethics (1 hour)
- Law Enforcement Family (1 hour)

<u>Part 2: Complete Peer Support for Individuals Experiencing Distress (PSIED) prior to attending the 20-Hour Basic</u> <u>Certification Classroom Instruction.</u>

- Our partners in training, Crisis Support Solutions, offers the 16-hour course at multiple locations statewide.

NOTE: If the student does not complete Part 1 and/or Part 2 prior to registering for Part 3, the student will not be eligible to apply for certification until all requirements are satisfied. Part 1 and Part 2 must be completed within one year completing the Basic Certification Classroom Instruction.

Part 3: 20-Hour-Basic Certification Classroom Instruction
