Lead your agency in roadway safety. Attend this **no-cost**, four-hour executive course, in which you will participate in discussions with other executive and mid-level officers about how to **increase officer safety during roadway operations**. The course provides an overview of available research about the risk factors for officer-involved collisions and struck-by incidents, and it identifies a variety of interventions and technological innovations that can reduce the likelihood of their occurrence.

The course draws from the success of the Las Vegas, Nevada, Metropolitan Police Department's comprehensive crash prevention program, as well as widely accepted traffic incident management principles, to provide executives with resources and actionable steps to improve the safety of their officers on the roadways.
